Mary Louise Jones Ginn was born in Calhoun County, Orangeburg, South Carolina on April 23, 1946. She was the daughter of the late Booker T. Jones and Louise Dash-Jones. Louise was the youngest of six siblings. She attended school at Orangeburg-Wilkinson High School in South Carolina. At an early age she accepted the Lord Jesus Christ as her personal Savior. Louise was baptized and became a member of Bull Swamp Baptist Church, there she served faithfully.

Louise later moved to Newark, NJ she then furthered her education. She attended Essex County Technical Institute. After graduating, she was employed with Newark Slip Company. She afterwards worked for Bell Phone Company for several years. She became interested in the import/export industry and started working for MSAS Freight Forwarder. After attaining more experience she began working for Jagro Freight Forwarder and for Carotrans International. There she worked in the capacity of export documentation for eleven years until she passed through the gates of heaven on Friday, November 12, 2010.

Louise joined Union Gospel Tabernacle, U.H.C.O.A. under the leadership of Pastor Grover L. McCrea. She later moved membership to the Greater Bethlehem Healing Temple in Newark under the leadership of Pastor Brian J. Mosley. There she served as President of the Missionary Board. Louise was known for her motto "Help Somebody Today" and that she did! That was the life she lived helping all of those that

were in need which was her ministry. She went on to establish the Greater Cathedral Revival Center, Inc in Irvington, NJ on October 31, 1993.

Through this organization, thousands have been fed, souls saved and lives transformed through the feeding ministry in the Township of Irvington, NJ since October 1993.

In addition to the feeding ministry, she also had nursing home ministries at Jay Street Nursing Home in Newark, NJ, Brookhaven Nursing Home in East Orange, NJ and two other nursing homes in Montclair, NJ which started with just her and her two girls, Wanda and Darlene. As time went on three grew into additional volunteers.

Many honor awards were bestowed upon her, one of which was the 1996 Governor's Award under the administration of Christine Todd Whitman for "Benefiting Seniors."

Louise was united in holy matrimony to Mr. Wallace Ginn. To this union two daughters were born.

She leaves to cherish her memories: two daughters, Wanda [Alfonso] Ginn-Smith and Darlene [William Ir.] Hargrove; two adoptive sisters, Adele Foster of Newark, NJ and Lee Haigler of Stewartsville, NJ; one brother-in-law, Deacon Henry Carson, Jr. of Orange, NJ and one sister-in-law, Ms. Mozelle Jones of Orangeburg, SC. She is also survived by a host of nieces, grand nieces, nephews, grand nephews, cousins, other relatives and friends.
