

As a young girl, Albertha accepted the Lord as her personal Saviour and became a member of Wesley Chapel Methodist Church in Lake City, SC. Whenever she visited South Carolina, it was important to her to visit the church, however in New Jersey she was an active member of Seminary Baptist Church, Paterson, NJ where she served on the Nurses Board.

Albertha was a devoted caregiver to family members, (especially her grandchildren) and neighborhood children, alike. She constantly devoted her time and energy into their lives, encouraging them to be the best that they could be. Berta was a king hearted and compassionate soul who offered advice and love to all she came into contact with.
