# Life Reflections

The Lord blessed this world with **Elouise "Nanny" Green** on February 4th 1922, on the West Coast of Florida. She was born to the late Hattie Mae Burley and George Dale and raised by her beloved stepfather, John Green.

In her youth, Elouise attended and graduated from Industrial High School in West Palm Beach, Florida. There she excelled as a star athlete, eventually earning All-State honors in basketball. Off of the court she spent her time cooking and taking care of her younger family members.

As a young adult, she enjoyed going dancing. Elouise could be found doing the "Lindy Hop" with her childhood friends, the late Robert L. Bragg and Deloree "Aunt Tee" Stargell. "Aunt Tee" would later introduce her to her future husband, the late Lemerrow Green, Sr. who gave her her nickname "Kitty". Elouise would marry Lemerrow in 1939 and through this union they would have three children, Lemerrow, Jr., Patricia and Cordell to whom they dedicated their lives.

The Greens relocated their family to Rahway, New Jersey in the early 1940's. While residing in Rahway, she worked as a seamstress as well as an in home caregiver. For a short time she also worked on a naval base.

She later became an integral part in the foundation of Holy Mountain Church of God in Christ. There she served on the Deaconess Board, the Mothers Board, the Pastors Aid Committee and the Kitchen Committee.

Elouise will be remembered for her commitment to God, her sense of humor and her stylish wardrobe.

She was predeceased by her husband, Lemerrow Green, Sr., a sister, Helen Wilson and grandson, Kevin Charles Green.
