

<u>Obituary</u>

Louisa Jackson Kidd, fondly known as LuLu and Nee Nee, was born on November 25, 1929 to parents, Josephine Young Jackson and Worther Ted Jackson, in Shreveport, Louisiana, where she grew up with her three siblings, Joseph, Lillie Virginia and Benjamin "Bert" Jackson; all surrounded by the love of a large and caring family.

Louisa graduated from Central Colored High School in Shreveport, Louisiana on May 30, 1947. She later left her family home and at the age of 23, married Willie D. Kidd on October 17, 1953, together they resided in Detroit, MI. A mother of three, she suffered the loss of her first son, who died at birth. She later gave birth to her daughter, Sharon Kidd-Hurst, and her son Charles Kidd. She was also blessed with grandchildren, Latasha and Bruce Hurst and great granddaughter, Shay'lah Lewis.

During her life, Louisa traveled many cities with her best friend and sister, Lillie, and has lived in Kansas City Missouri, and Omaha, Nebraska, before finally settling in Newark, New Jersey. To "be of service" seems to have been her motto because of her many jobs she has been a waitness, a cafeteria attendant, a nurse's aide and she even worked at a service station, but she eventually retired from the United States Postal Service in 1990 with over 25 years of service. After retirement, Louisa found another way to serve her community by delivering meals to the "shut-in" as an employee of Meals on Wheels.

Louisa was an immaculate dresser, whose well groomed hair and nails were a particular source of pride. Some of Louisa's many talents included, baking, sewing, cooking and mathematics. Louisa had a great love of children and a great deal of patience, which she often employed when teaching others to drive.

Louisa was a born again Christian whose devout worship inspired and provided a religious foundation for her children, nieces, nephews and grandchildren. Throughout her lifetime, she offered loving counsel and guidance to her friends and family. Many remember her as a mentor, an excellent listener and as a dedicated friend. She had a vivacious laugh, which gladdened the hearts of all who heard it. Louisa loved all her family unconditionally and would always fight for the rights of others; she was our family's great champion and we will miss her greatly.
