Janie felt blessed to have a special relationship with her daughter-in-law, Yvette who took special care of her during her husband's illness. Janie told everyone "She was the daughter I never had."

She departed this life on Friday, May 14, 2011. She leaves to cherish her memory; three sons, William, Jr. (Patsy), Gary (Rosalind) and Mark (Yvette); eight grandchildren, Matthew (Amber), Maria, Melody, Christina, Douglass, Courtney, Diamond and Eugene; twin great-grandchildren, Jacob and Joseph with another one on the way: and a special cousin, Garlene Allen.
