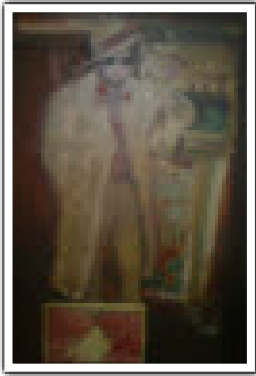

James Reynolds or “Hickey” as he was affectionately called by his family and friends. Hickey was born in Paterson, NJ on February 13 (14), 1940 to Fendley and Buler (Alexander) Reynolds.

Hickey attended Paterson Public School #6 and later attended Don Bosco Tech. He was employed as a Manager for Paterson Parking Authority for many years, he worked for many employers before becoming disabled while working as a driver for Paterson Community Health Center.

Hickey was a very popular man in Paterson. He couldn't go anywhere, where someone did not know him. Hickey was a very affectionate and giving person who loved being outside. He made "Brother-like" relationships with guys he hung out with, especially John Kelly, Gist, Gary and Fuller.

Hickey met his life-long partner and companion Gladys Saunders in 1966. They united as a couple a year later having four children from this union.

In 2009, Hickey gave his life to Jesus Christ Our Savior for the second time when he joined the Community Baptist Church of Love. He was a faithful member until his illness in 2010.
