Susan wasn't just Mommy to her family, she was Momma to her extended family. She use to say, "everybody can't be a preacher, you need a worker", she was that. She was saved, sanctified and filled with the Holy Ghost. As the song says, "If you live right, Heaven belongs to you." The gates of heaven were open wide, welcoming home one of their faithful servants.
