Obituary

Maxine Lang Shepard went home to be with the Lord on Tuesday, August 2, 2011. A devoted wife, caring daughter, beloved sister, trusted friend, and faithful Christian, Maxine was a great blessing to all who encountered her.

Maxine Lang was born on January 23, 1937 to Alphonso and Margaret Lang in New York City. After graduation from Morris High School, Maxine completed nursing school at Fordham University and earned certification as a Registered Nurse. She later returned to school and earned a Bachelor of Science Degree in Nursing from Hunter College, City University of New York. With her nursing degree, she went on to work as a school nurse for the New York City Department of Education. She worked in the capacity of school nurse until her retirement.

In 1980, Maxine married Edward L. Shepard, Sr. As a devoted wife and partner in ministry, Maxine became very involved in her husband's outreach ministry in addition to her own. They worked side by side in ministry, especially at Harlem Hospital, where they were recently recognized by the mayor's office for their years of dedicated volunteer service.

Maxine grew up in the church, and she accepted Jesus Christ as her Lord and Savior at the early age of 9. She was raised in Kelly Temple Church of God in Christ (currently pastored by Bishop James Gaylord)—where her parents were among the founding members. After many years at Kelly Temple, Maxine joined with her husband at Bethel Gospel Assembly and served as a faithful, active member for the balance of her days. At Bethel, Maxine served in the Becoming God's Answer Bookstore, and as a board member of the Alabaster Women of Faith. She also pursued a course of study in Christian counseling. Maxine was installed as a Deacon at Bethel in February of 2010.

Maxine traveled extensively throughout the Caribbean, Asia, and Europe for various mission endeavors and conferences. Her missionary journeys also took her to Haiti and parts of Africa. In all of her Christian endeavors, she served quietly and selflessly, always content to be behind the scenes.
