

HER STORY

Mary Ethel Pringle Cohen Brantley, affectionately known as Ethel, daughter of the late Annie Mae Smith Gordon and the late Lavin Pringle, was born on December 26, 1931 in Estill, South Carolina. She departed this life on August 6, 2011 at the Cornell Hall Nursing Home, Union, New Jersey.

Mary attended school in Estill, South Carolina, where she was a basketball player for her school team for which she was very "**proud**". At an early age, she joined Mount Moriah Baptist Church, Pineland, SC. She underwent a religious experience and accepted Christ as her personal Savior. At St. Paul F.B.H. Church, Newark, NJ, she renewed her covenant with God and was sanctified and filled with the Holy Ghost. She served in many capacities at the Church; as a licensed Missionary, Sunday School Teacher and Superintendent. She always offered a helping hand to anyone in need and visited the sick and shut-in and was a true Nursing Home Evangelist.
