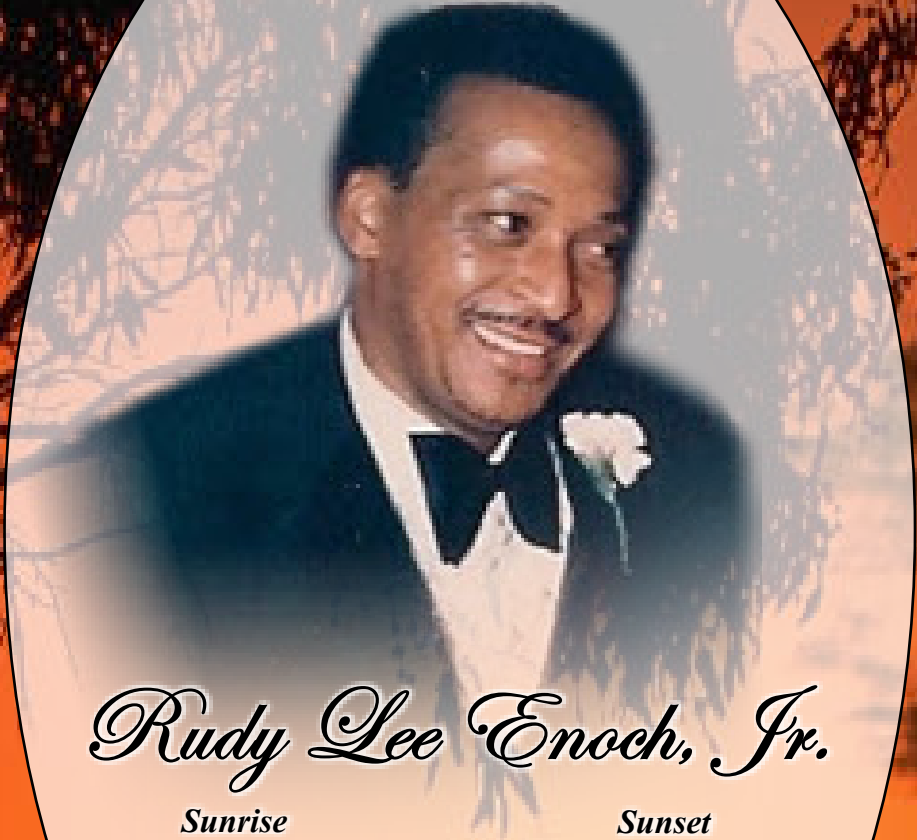

Obituary

Rudy Lee Enoch, Jr. was born March 13, 1925 in Burlington, North Carolina to Rudy Lee Enoch, Sr. and Stella Morton. During his early childhood, Rudy attended the Burlington School system and the community church with his siblings. Rudy had twelve siblings, three brothers and nine sisters.

Burlington, North Carolina during the 1930's and 40's was not kind to all of its citizens; limited job opportunities coupled with racial prejudices forced Rudy to leave his hometown and family for a better life in the Northeast. In 1942, at the age of seventeen, Rudy left Burlington, North Carolina for New York City. For years he worked as a truck driver for a company in New York City and some years later volunteered for military service in the U.S. Army, where he served approximately two and a half years in Korea.

Following his military discharge, he met Mildred Norwood and they later married in 1951. Although Rudy Lee Enoch, Jr. was a private and quiet man, he was greatly loved by everyone who knew him. He enjoyed a blessed family filled with the joys of traditional holiday celebrations, family reunions, birthdays and children of all ages calling upon "Uncle Rudy."

Rudy leaves behind: his devoted and loving wife, Mildred; three children, (Carlisle, Eddie and Gina - deceased); three siblings, Wilton, Arleen and Annie Lou; nieces, nephews, cousins and many friends and associates who will greatly miss him.

We all carry our own remembrances of Rudy; some memories will make us smile while others will sadden our hearts but I believe Rudy would want us to remember that the last parts of his life were better than it's beginning.... *"The Lord giveth and the Lord taketh away, blessed be the name of the Lord."*

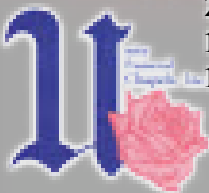
