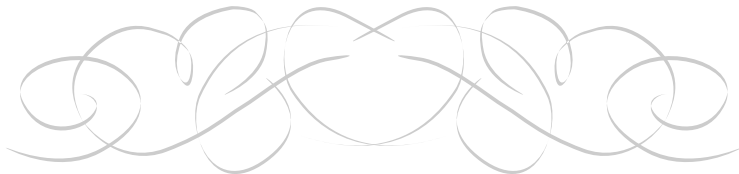

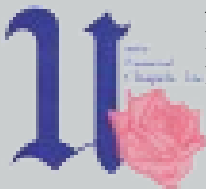
Nana was the best
