# The Obituary

Ann L. Walker was born in Marion, AL on April 4, 1934, the second child of the late Edward K. Evans Sr. and Ella J. Carlisle Evans. She had two siblings, both are deceased, Arthur Evans and Edward K. Evans Jr. Ann was educated at Lincoln H.S. in Marion, AL and went on to attend Alabama State from 1952 to 1954. Ann was raised by her mother, Ella and the late Rev. D.V.S. Carlisle, a messenger of God and an accomplished businessman.

In 1954, Mother moved to New York City where she met Raymond F. Walker. On June 25, 1955, Mother married Raymond Walker. From this union came four sons, Raymond Walker preceded her in death on January of 1982.

Ann Walker was baptized as a child in 1946 and again in 1985 at Elmendorf Reformed Church by Rev. Johnson. Ann chose to serve the Lord by serving as choir leader of the children's choir, and

librarian of the chancellor choir. Ann also was a member of the Harlem Historical Research Society. She directed the chancellor choir, as well as sang in the choir until she was physically unable to, and was a member of the women's ministry.

Ann was employed with the State of New York at Manhattan State Hospital where she worked as an Occupational Therapist Assistant for thirty years of service. She retired on January 1, 1991.

Mother spent her retirement years enjoying life. She traveled to Israel with friends, to Phoenix, AZ to see her grandchildren and nephew, and other locations to keep in touch with family and friends. Mother's pastime was spent "shopping" whether it was QVC, HSN or a daily walk to Pathmark.

On January 2011, Ann suffered a severe stroke from which she did not recover.
