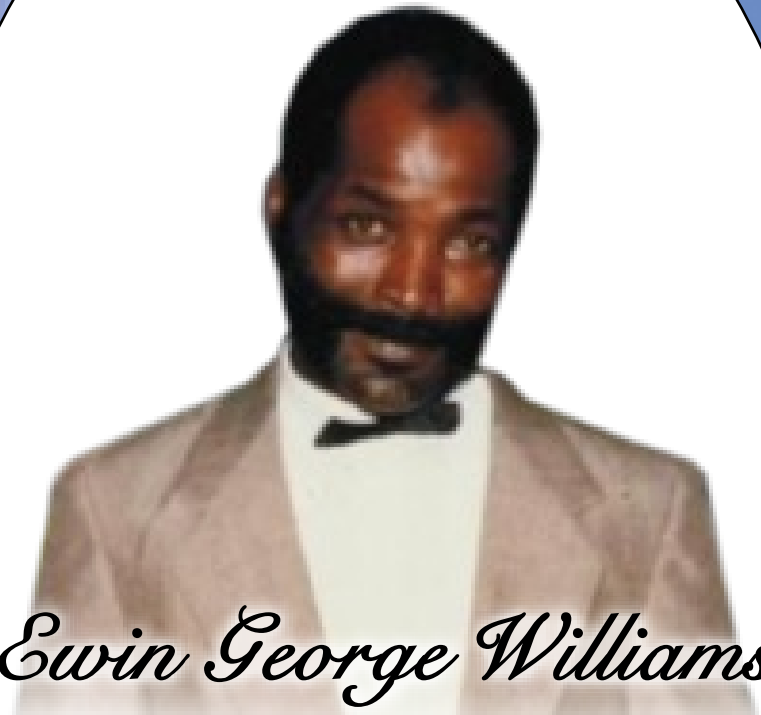

Obituary
