Obituary

Doretha Aluns was born in Springhills, North Carolina on August 22, 1926. She was the youngest of three children born to Henry and Lou McPhatter. Her two older brothers were Roscoe and Clarence McPhatter.

Doretha Aluns was a founding member of the English-Speaking Congregation of Jefferson Park Parish (Methodist) in 1961. She was a key leader in the new congregation and served as chair of the Official Board and President of United Methodist Women, she brought her children Audrey, Mack Jr., Lois and Roscoe into the church. With Mrs. Helen Love, she lead the Sunday School and was a faithful teacher. President Lyndon Johnson's War on Poverty included a new program to provide free pre-k programs nationwide, called Operation Head Start. Doretha was chosen as a leader in one of the first Headstart Programs in New York City and worked in the program for several years. She was a no-nonsense Christian and a great support to her first pastor, Rev. John Collins. She organized a banquet and wedding for Rev. Collins in four days.

When Jefferson Park Parish was merged with the Taft Houses Methodist Church to form the Madison Avenue United Methodist Church, Doretha and her family became the leaders in the new merged congregation. Her daughter, Audrey and son, Mack, Jr. became key leaders as well. Doretha remained a leader in the church for over forty years until illness prevented her from active involvement. She certainly was welcomed into heaven with the biblical commendation "Well done thou good and faithful servant. Enter now into the joy of your Master."

Doretha leaves behind to cherish her loving memories: her sons, Mack, Jr. and Roscoe Aluns; daughter, Audrey Wilson; grandchildren, James Wilson III, Leticia Hooks, Jonathan Aluns, Michael Aluns and Ian Aluns; great grandchildren, LaNeyce Jarrette, Alliyah Wilson, Zariel Hooks and Andre Wilson; nephews, Gerard Gillian and Allison McPhatter; nieces, Mae Doris Creque and Blanche McPhatter; and a host of other relatives and friends.
