THE BEGINNING

Viola Brown Allen was born April 16, 1915 on John's Island, South Carolina. She was the fourth child to be born to Nathaniel Brown and Ella Ford Brown. Her siblings were Julia, Emily, Alonzo and Willamena. Viola was the last surviving child of that union.

She and her siblings attended Presbyterian Church School on John's Island for their early elementary education. Viola then attended, but did not complete Avery High School. She learned the value of hard work under the guidance of her parents, Ella and Nathaniel Brown and by completing the daily chores on the family farm. She helped to collect food planted and care for the animals. The crops included cotton, peanuts, peas, and a variety of vegetation.

Viola was always working and had the energy to continue long after everyone was tired. That exuberant quality, coupled with her motivation, remained with her throughout her life.

NEW YORK

Viola migrated to New York in the mid-1930's. She met and married Thomas Allen shortly after. They were loving and hard working parents and gave birth to two girls, Juila and Lucy Chela. In the midst of raising their daughters, Thomas was called away too soon. He died in 1965, leaving Viola to raise the girls. Viola, in her usual fashion of self-reliance and determination, wasted no time in developing herself so that she could better carry out her parental duties.

CHURCH

Viola was active as a youth in the Presbyterian Church in South Carolina. She lived by the conveyed through her church. She and Thomas attended his Baptist church during their marriage; but after his death, she renewed her commitment to the faith of her youth by becoming a member of the Mt. Morris Presbyterian Church in Manhattan. She served as a Sunday school teacher, an usher, a deaconess, and an elder. She was a member of the Bible Study group and also regularly visited the sick and shut-in. Viola had a lovely voice, and she loved performing solos and singing in the church choir.
