Ethel departed this life December 24, 2011. She was a long resident of Newark, NJ (eighty-five years).

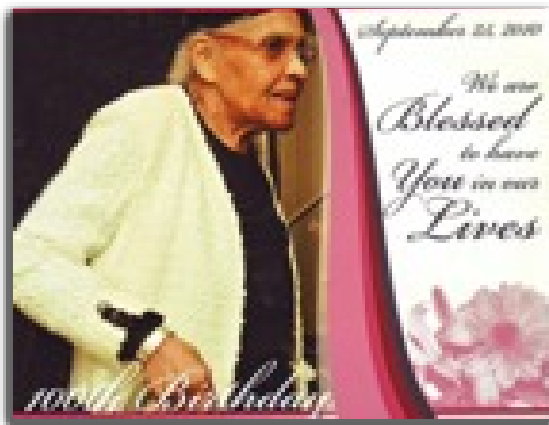
Ethel joined in holy matrimony to Earl W. Davis on December 13, 1928 and seven children were born of this union.
