When home he was an active member of the Southeast Queens community and a proud Brother of the Pride of Jamaica Lodge 217 Elks Lodge, where held many offices over the years including King of the Elks and Past State President.

After multiple visits to her business under the pretense of buying records, John got up the nerve to ask Bernice out on a date, she agreed and the romance began. John and Bernice were married on January 20th 1967. Upon marriage John proudly took on the responsibility of helping Bernice raise her four young sons Ronald, Dwight, Bernard and Byron. In April of 1967, their union was blessed with a son Kenneth John. As the years went by the couple developed a special place in the hearts and family for two young men, Ronnie Brown and Richard Wills and considered both of them to be their adopted sons.
