Aunt Gloria had a host of cousins she was extremely close to, but shared a particularly close bond with Cousin Eddie (Edward H. Johnson). She always said that he was more like a brother to her than a cousin and he always called her "Sis." Up until the very end of Aunt Gloria's life she always spent time reminiscing about their childhood and his "good hair." Did you know that Aunt Gloria played the violin and spoke French and Swahili? And that she used to address her greatnephew GnI as Monsieur?

Aunt Gloria was preceded in death by her parents George and Lena Davis, siblings Reginald Thomas Davis, Marilyn Smalley, great-niece Kellie M. Key, nephew George F. Davis as well as her one true love, husband Karl Anthony Butler.
