Malcolm Alexander Mascall, age 81, of Cedar Grove, Antigua went home to be with the Lord, Tuesday, February 21, 2012.

Malcolm Alexander Mascall was born April 3, 1930 in Cedar Grove Village, Antigua to Victor Mascall and Alice Warner, both whom preceded him in death. He was called home on February 21, 2012 at Colombia Presbyterian Hospital, Manhattan, New York. He was a faithful member of St. Mary's Anglican Church, Bronx, New York.
