

### <u>Obituary</u>

**Alyce Elizabeth English** was born on September 4, 1922, in Hanover County located in Virginia. She was the second of eight children born to Delia and John Thomas. Alyce peacefully departed this life on Tuesday, May 22, 2012 surrounded by her loved ones, at the Bellevue Hospital Center in Manhattan. She was eighty-nine years old.

Delia and John Thomas raised their family in Harlem, New York and lived at 2087 Madison Avenue between 131st and 132nd Streets. Alyce attended elementary school at Public School 124 and junior high school at Harriet Beecher Stowe (Public School 136). She also attended and graduated high school in New York City.

Alyce married her childhood sweetheart, Harden English, on August 10, 1940, in New York City. They became the proud parents of four children, Dorothy, Joyce, Patricia and Reginald.

Alyce was a faithful member of Metropolitan A.M.E. Church in Harlem and sometimes accompanied her daughter Dorothy to St. Ambrose Episcopal Church also in Harlem. As Alyce's illness progressed, she expressed sadness about not being able to attend church every Sunday.

Alyce worked in New York at the VA Hospital as a Nurse's Assistant, and at Saint Martin's Church Credit Union as a Financial Assistant. She retired after years of dedicated service due to her failing health.

Affectionately known as "Al" or "Nana", she was always smartly dressed and the life of the family circle. Alyce was a loving and caring mother and grandmother, but not afraid to put people in their place. Above all, Alyce was a fighter. A three-time cancer survivor, she was always determined to follow her own course and, to the end, her mind was sharp as a tack.

Preceding her in death are her husband, Harden English; her daughter, Dorothy Randolph; her brother, James Thomas; and her sisters, Edith Sanders, Ruby Thomas, Rosetta Keggler, and Ruth Mitchell.
