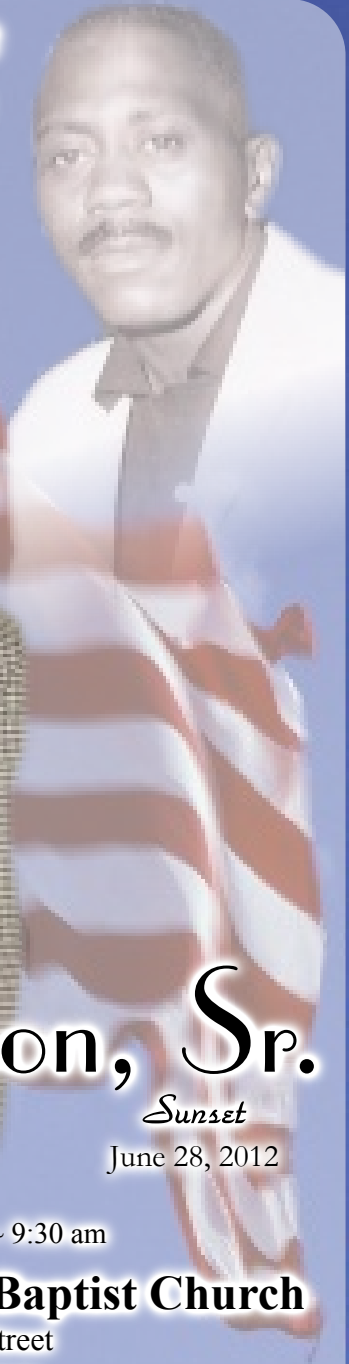
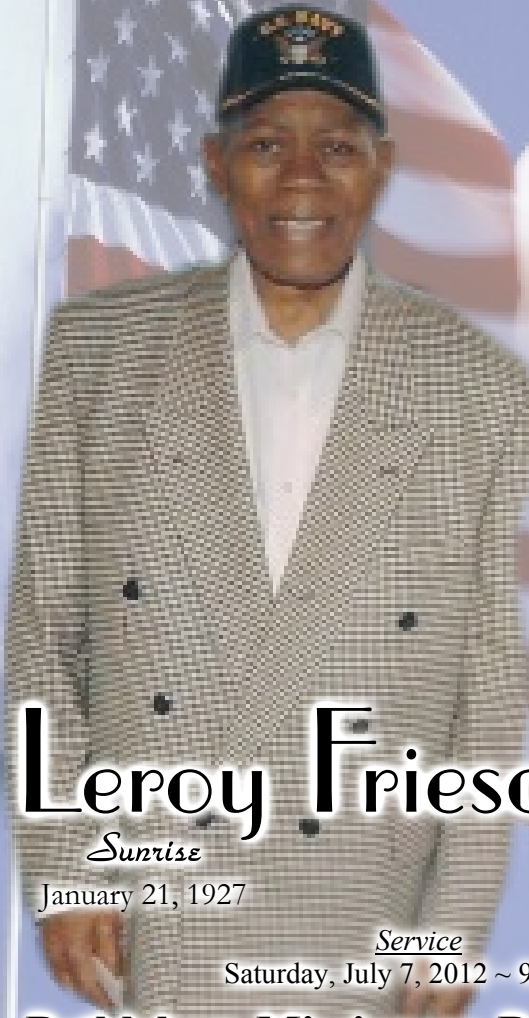

Life Reflections

Leroy Frieson, Sr. was born on January 21, 1927 in Riverdale, West Virginia to the late Thomas Edward Frieson, Sr. and Mary Ellen Raines Frieson, and stepson of Deacon Robert Griffin, Sr. he was the youngest of three children.

He completed his early education in Fairmount, West Virginia, and graduated from Monongalia High School.

Leroy received an honorable discharge from the United States Navy on August 7, 1946 as a Class "C" Navy Seaman. He later received an honorable discharge from the US Army on July 22, 1952. He received the CIBAD, Korean Service Medal with three Bronze SVC Stars, and the Distinguished Unit Citation for being wounded in combat. He attained the rank of Corporal.

After serving in the military, he moved to Roselle where he met and married the late Gladys Sizemore Frieson. To this union four children were born.

He was member of Bethlehem Missionary Baptist Church for more than forty years.

Leroy was employed by Metal Textile in Roselle for ten years, and General Motors Corporation in Linden as an Inspector for thirty-one years, retiring 2002. He was a member of Local 595 United Auto Workers (UAW).

He sang with the famous "Platters" in the 1950s and early 1960s.

Leroy was well known for his dapper attire, and his love for sports. His favorite past time sport was shooting pool.

His wife, Gladys Frieson passed away in 2010.

Leroy Frieson, Sr. leaves to cherish his fondest memories, his daughter, Robin R. Frieson of Linden; three sons, Leroy Frieson, Jr. of New York, Mark Anthony Frieson of Linden and Rodney Frieson of Roselle; twelve grandchildren, eleven great-grandchildren, nieces, nephews, cousins and a host of other relatives and friends.

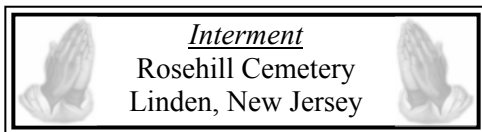
