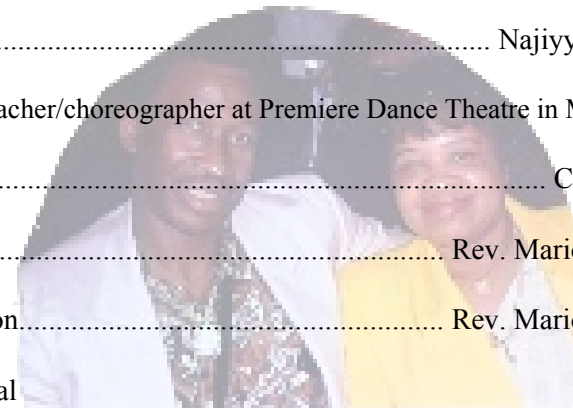
She was preceded in death by her three brothers, Grant Jackson Jr., William Jackson, and Frank Jackson.
