### Obituary

**George S. Leidinger Jr.**, eighty-seven, peacefully went to rest on August 3, 2012, with his wife Eunice Leidinger by his side in Queens, New York.

He was born on July 22, 1925, in Brooklyn to George and Rachael Leidinger. He was the eldest of six children and the only boy of five sisters Shirley, Barbara, Gerry, Deloris and Gloria.

George was first drafted into the military during WWII and then later during the Korean War and Berlin Crisis. During his time served with the United States Army, he attained the highest enlisted rank of E9 Sargent Major and was awarded several achievements, medals and awards. He was the last commanding reserves soldier in WWII to retire in 1986. His career started in law enforcement in 1951 with his retirement from the New York Police Department on February 16, 1972.

He met his wife Eunice after he returned from his first tour of duty in 1946. They later married on August 1, 1948. They had three sons, George III, Keith Brian and Darren Hugh.

After his retirement, he enjoyed going to live shows, attending concerts and traveling with his wife and club members. He especially enjoyed spending time with family and friends.

Mr. Leidinger is survived by: his sisters, Shirley, Gerry and Barbara; two sons and daughter-in-law, George and Joy Leidinger and Keith Leidinger; six grandchildren; two great-grandchildren; and numerous nieces, nephews and grand-nieces and nephews.

He was preceded in death by his son, Darren Leidinger and two sisters, Gloria and Deloris.
