On August 2, 2012, **Trustee Vermell Jennings** departed this life of labor and was called to eternal rest at the Newark Extended Care Facility, Jay Street, Newark after battling years of illness.

In her leisure time, she enjoyed and loved bowling and was a member of FMBC Bowling League and the Essex County Welfare League until she could no longer participate.
