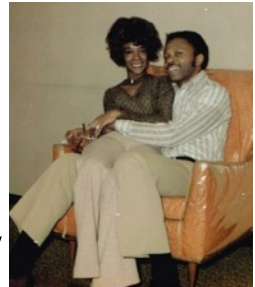
Frances was a Nurse’s Aid at Preakness Hospital in Halden, New Jersey for over sixteen years, retiring in 1992.
