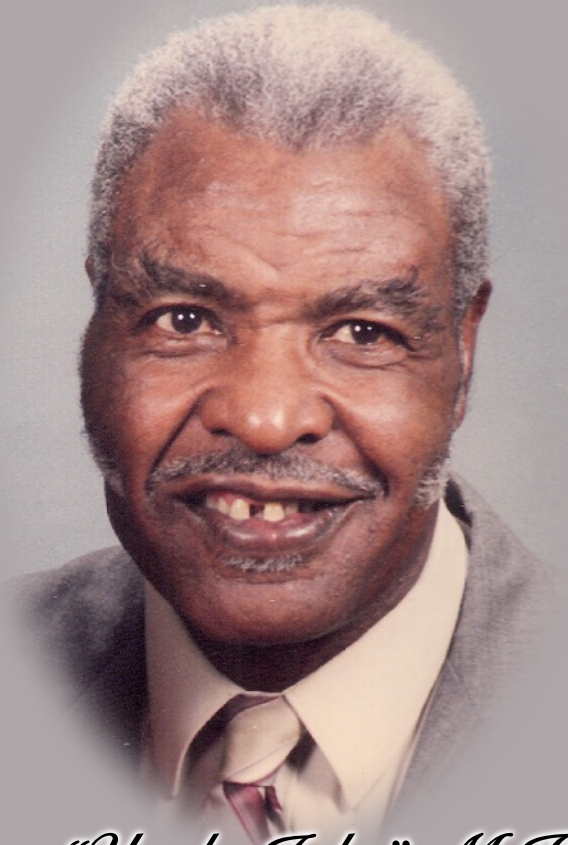

Reflections of Life



James McKinney, the fourth child born to the late Peter and Mattie Lou (Bryant) McKinney, entered into this life on October 23, 1923 in Johnston, South Carolina. He entered into eternal life on September 2, 2012 in Passaic, New Jersey.

Born to an unusually large clan that was spread out between two counties and several churches.

At an early age, he professed Christ as his Personal Savior and was baptized and became a member of the Mt. Calvary Baptist Church in Edgefield County, South Carolina.

One of four sons, the work ethic was instilled in him by his father. As a teenager he lost his leg in a sawmill accident, but this did not prevent him from living a full life.

In 1948, he met the former Lucille Kelso and on June 24, 1948, they were joined together in holy matrimony.

James was employed by Spotless Cleaners in Paterson, New Jersey, as a shoe repairman (a trade he had learned in South Carolina), until his retirement. James also worked at Harvey Knobby Shoe Company, Passaic.

The McKinney 's joined Calvary Baptist Church in Garfield under the leadership of the late F.A. LaGarde. They followed their pastor to Paterson where he founded the Community Baptist Church, Paterson, NJ.

He was predeceased by three brothers, Fred (Clara), John Henry (Lillie Mae) and Charles (Ann Jurely) and brother-in-law, Willie Robinson.

Uncle Jake's love for all and memory will forever be engraved in the hearts and beings of his loving wife of sixty-three years, Lucille; his sister, Susie Mae Robinson; two godchildren, Harold and Daniel Todd McKinney; three brothers-in-law; one sister-in-law; and a host of nieces, nephews, cousins, other relatives and friends.
