In 1950, he enlisted into the US Army, Korean Campaign, entering as a Paratrooper rising to rank of Master Sergeant, Military Police.

Early on, Lloyd was employed by the Paterson Board of Education. In 1965, he became Director of Environmental Services at Bergen Pines Hospital, Paramus, NJ retiring as Director of Environmental Services for Bergen City, Hackensack, NJ.

Lloyd was a sports enthusiasts serving as umpire for the city league Blue Palace Pirates expanding to the Tri County Umpires Assoc. Active in his community. Lloyd served as supervisor for teenage program at Paterson Task Force; member of Young Men of Paterson Social Club Sponsored by McDonald's, Broadway, Paterson, NJ.

Until his illness Lloyd was an active member of Integrity Lodge #51 F&AM, where he was Past Master, American Lodge #333 I.B.P.O.E. of W., Fidelity Chapter #16 OES and Golconda Temple #24 A.E.O.N.M.S. His proudest accomplishment was "Crossing the Desert".

A former member of Second Baptist Church and Calvary Baptist Church both of Paterson, NJ and recently attended Metropolitan AME Zion of Ridgewood, NJ.


Touching the lives of many. Lloyd maintained his trademark booming voice and sense of humor til the end.
