Rudolph Ottey was born in the Parish of Hanover in Jamaica, West Indies in a little town called Pond Side, to Phillip and Alberta Ottey on August 14, 1926.

He attended school in Hanover and after a few years he migrated to England to pursue a better life. He lived in England until the early 1980's then migrated to New York City to live in the Bronx.

While living in the Bronx, Rudolph would work as a plumber to support him and his family. Prior to moving to England, Rudolph was married, this union produced six children that are now grown. He went on to divorce his first wife and later married Passylin Rudolph. Rudolph and Passylin were members of the New Testament Church of Good, in Brooklyn, New York. While Rudolph lived at 950 Union Avenue he helped to secure the building on a part time basis until he became ill. He was very helpful to the people he came in contact with. He enjoyed traveling to Jamaica to spend time with his family and friends.

He leaves to mourn: his loving wife, Passylin; son, Richard; daughter, Gloria; scores of grandchildren and great grandchildren, other family members and friends.
