

<u>Reflections of Life</u>

Marcellus Melson was born in Coweta County, Georgia on February 8, 1914 to the late Lovie Dunson and Walker Melson. He attended McClelland Academy in Newnan, Georgia, Fort Valley State College and received an MA in Education from New York University (NYU), Marcellus and Lauretta met in Newman, Georgia as teenagers. Although Lauretta attended high school in Tennessee, their friendship continued in college, and he married his childhood sweetheart.

Prior to moving to Paterson, New Jersey, Marcellus and his late wife taught school in Georgia. After relocating to New Jersey, he worked in the accounting offices at Curtiss Wright Aeronautical Corporation and NYC Dryden Press. For more than twenty years, he took pride in educating and motivating children as an English Teacher at Public School in Paterson. He loved reading, gardening, music and played the piano as well as cheering for the Mets, win or lose. His steadfast faith in God was the foundation for his role as an elder at the St. Augustine and the United Presbyterian Churches, Paterson. At ninety-eight years of age he would still talk about his belief in God's Promises and pray daily.

He was predeceased by his wife of fifty-nine years, Lauretta (Parks) Melson, infant daughter, Terry and eight brothers and sisters.
