Charles D. Settle was raised in McCormick, South Carolina, and later graduated from high school in Swainsboro, Georgia. Charles Settle, Sr. was baptized at Yosemite Baptist Church in Lexsy, Georgia in Emanuel County. Charles later served as a medic in the United States Army during the Korean war, from which he was later disabled and honorably discharged.

Charles Settle Sr. later graduated from Seton Hall University with a Bachelor’s Degree.

While working at Bamberger’s Department Store in Newark, New Jersey, he met the love of his life, Jean R. Allen. They were married on October 23, 1965, and this union was blessed with 4 children, Mia, Charles, Jr., Brian and Wayne. They lived in Linden, New Jersey before moving to Piscataway 10 years ago.
