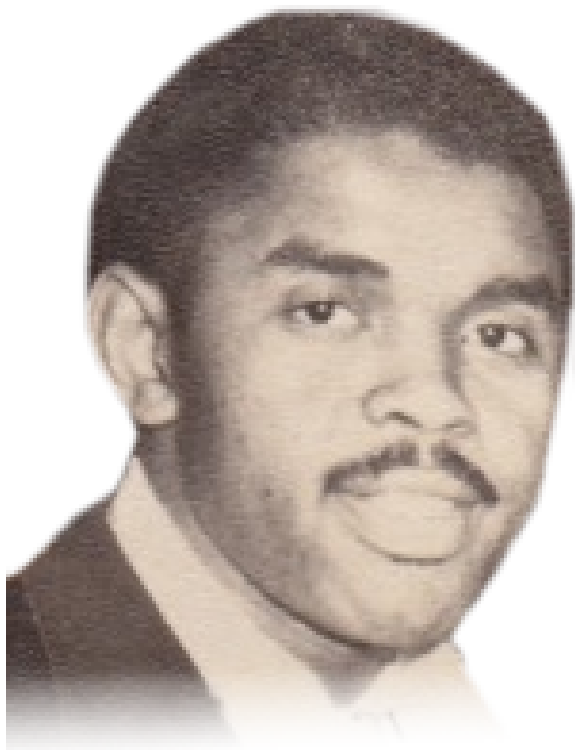
Frederick was a long time church member with Trinity United Methodist Church and dedicated singer in the choir.
