Life Reflections

Lloyd Lowell Langley was born on June 9, 1918 in Lynchburg, Virginia, son of the late Lloyd Langley and Mary Jordan Langley. During his childhood he attended Rivermont Baptist Church. After graduating from Dunbar High School in Lynchburg, Lloyd attended Virginia State College in Petersburg, Virginia. In 1943, he joined the United States Coast Guard and served in World War II as an Electronic Technician Mate 3rd Class. Lloyd was assigned to the military Naval Ship Arthur Middleton APA 25. He was honorably discharged in 1946.

On September 27, 1941, Lloyd married the former Marion Anderson, his childhood sweetheart. The couple moved from Lynchburg to Bronx, New York, where they became members of St. Paul's Episcopal Church. Two daughters were born from this union: Brenda Jeanette and Evonne Charisse. In 1958 the family moved to their new home in Westbury, Long Island, New York.

Lloyd was employed as a Federal Government Quality Assurance Representative for over thirty-four years. During that time he also sold insurance, mutual funds and repaired televisions part-time. After retirement he was an Electronics Engineering Instructor at SUNY, Farmingdale for seven years. Lloyd also served as an appointee to several New York State Governors on the Board of Visitors, overseeing and reporting on the quality of Hospital and Medical Care. In addition, he served as Worshipful Master of Prince Hall Ashlar Lodge #94, and received the honor of a 33rd degree mason.

Lloyd and Marion were inseparable, doing everything together. They enjoyed attending their annual class reunions in Lynchburg, dancing, traveling and vacationing at the New Jersey shore. In later years, the couple became members of Westbury Community Church in Westbury and joined the church choir.

Mr. Langley was a very intelligent businessman and a great conversationalist. He enjoyed reading, keeping abreast of current events, and listening to all genres of music. Lloyd taught himself to play the "ukulele" and guitar early on, and later in life to play the piano. He was a good mechanic and a great handyman, designing and finishing the basement recreation room, building a bathroom, two bedrooms and furniture for the family's home.

The Langleys were residents at the Bristal Assisted Living in Westbury from May 2011 until July 2012. In August 2012 they transitioned to the Brighton Gardens Assisted Living/Skilled Nursing Facility in Edison, New Jersey.

Lloyd was predeceased by his brother, Purcell Langley in 1951, and his beloved wife of seventy -one years, Marion Elizabeth Langley on October 4, 2012. Lloyd loved the Lord and his family. On October 19, 2012, Lloyd Lowell Langley was called home to be with the Lord at the age of ninety-four.

He leaves to cherish his memory; two daughters, Brenda Jeanette Langley and Evonne Charisse Tyree; son-in-law, William H. Tyree; two grandsons, Reverend William Michael E. Tyree (Minister Marette) and Brandon Lloyd Tyree; great granddaughter, Michaela Elise Tyree; niece, Constance Ellerbe (John); grand nephew, Alan Ellerbe (Tywanna); grand niece, Dawn Ellerbe; and a host of other relatives and friends.
