Trustee George Spears (affectionately known as "Buddy"), the son of the late Beatrice Bethea and Sam Spears, Sr., was born on August 4, 1940 in Elizabethtown, North Carolina. He was the oldest son of 15 children and was predeceased by his step-mother, Nora B. Spears, brother, Edward Spears and two sisters, Mary Eaddy and Estelle Hyman.

George attended the public schools in Florence, South Carolina. Reared in a Christian home, George received Jesus Christ as his Lord and Savior and was baptized at an early age, uniting with the Elizabeth Baptist Church in Florence, SC.

In his early years prior to moving to New Jersey, George was a school bus driver in Florence, SC; this is where he first laid eyes on Ella Mae Mason.

George and Ella captured each other's hearts more than 51 years ago while in school and working in the farmlands. During their courtship, Ms. Eula (Ella's Grandmother) had a rule: George could **only** visit Ella at home on **Wednesdays** and **Sundays**. They were united in Holy Matrimony on July 29, 1961 by Rev. E.W. Cole, Pastor of the Wesley Methodist Church where Ella attended.
