Reflections of Life

Frances Anderson was born on June 29, 1919. She was the youngest of five children born to Anthony and Della Anderson of Columbia, South Carolina.

Frances received her elementary education in the South Carolina school system. She attributed her wisdom, courage and perseverance through her mother Della Anderson, who was a farmer. Frances was able to elevate herself leaving Columbia, South Carolina at the age of 19 to come up North to Newark, NJ to live with her mother and 4 sisters (Julia, Elizabeth, Henrietta, & Maggie) shortly after finding work Frances moved to Paterson, NJ. Where she resided on Paterson Street for many years, then to leave there going on to North Main Street then finally residing at River View Towers. Frances worked at Rail Manufacturer Saddle brook, NJ as a Machine Operator for 37 years.

Ms. Frances Anderson, a woman who was strong-willed and highly spirited began her faith in God at an early age. She became a member of Church of God and Saints of Christ Tabernacle #2 in Paterson, NJ. Frances Anderson was blessed with two children Allen Boyd, Ludella Boyd-Anderson both residing in New Jersey.

On June 29, 2012 Ms. Frances Anderson celebrated her 93rd birthday with many family members. On November 10, 2012 she was succumbed to Congestive Heart Failure at Care One Facility in Livingston, NJ.
