<u>Obituary</u>

Nathaniel N. Hardy, Jr. was born August 24, 1950 in Kansas City, Missouri to Nathaniel Hardy, Sr., and the late Edith Hazel Patterson. He departed this life on November 11, 2012.

Nathaniel, affectionately known as "Mitch," was a resident of East Orange, New Jersey.

Mitch attended school in Newark and in the mid-west, graduating in 1968 from Arsenal Technical High School in Indianapolis, Indiana. After high school, Mitch served in the United States Marines. He was a long time employee with the Newark Board Education until he became disabled.

Mitch was a devoted and adoring husband to his wife Victoria, to whom he was united in holy matrimony on July 4, 1987. The loving couple re-dedicated themselves to one another on July 7, 2012 as they celebrated their 25th wedding anniversary. Mitch was a loving and caring father, always singing the praises of his four sons — Ramon, Nathaniel III, Javon and Calvin.

In 1986, he joined Ephesian Baptist Church, which was later named New Covenant Missionary Baptist Church. Mitch was a dedicated servant of the Lord and sang in the church's Try Christ, Celestial, and Male Choirs. In 2004 Mitch was ordained as a Deacon where his service to the Lord and to New Covenant Missionary Baptist Church increased. In addition to serving on the choirs, he taught Sunday school and assisted in the Youth Ministry and Vacation Bible School. Deacon Hardy also labored with love alongside his Pastor by visiting and praying for sick Church members.

In addition to being a dedicated servant of God and Christ, husband, father, Deacon and friend, Mitch was also a talented singer and used his gift by singing lead in several bands in the Metropolitan area for over 30 years. Mitch will always be remembered for his winning smile, his infectious personality, his unique voice and his willingness to lend a helping hand whenever called upon.
