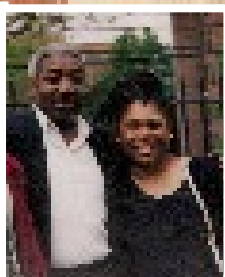
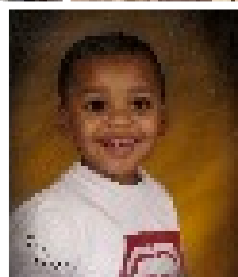
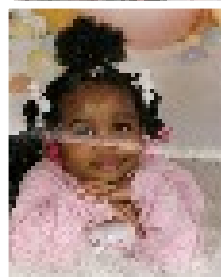
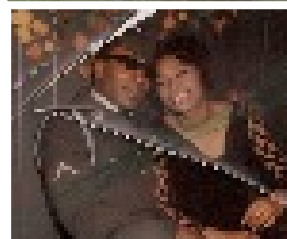
George was very handy with fixing cars for others. He also believed in pursuing higher education that's why he choose to attend Passaic County Community College and also Passaic County Technical Institute.
