<u>Life Reflections</u>

Willie Wiggins was born on May 6, 1921 in Rocky Mount, North Carolina, son of Annie Bell Lucas Wiggins and David Wiggins. Educated in the Rocky Mount Public School System, he studied masonry at Booker T. Washington High School. He completed his apprenticeship in North Carolina.

Mr. Wiggins was a United States Army veteran of World War II. He received the Asiatic Pacific Service Medal with 1 Bronze Star, the World War II Victory Medal and the Good Conduct Medal before his honorable discharge in 1946.

Willie met Ida Ruth Batts and they were joined in holy matrimony.

He began his career as a Brick Mason in Albany, New York. When he moved to New Jersey, he began working through B.A.C. Local 18 in Elizabeth, New Jersey, (now known as Local 4 in Fairfield, NJ) and continued there until he retired at the age of 62.

Willie had served as Past Master of Lincoln Lodge # 62 - F & AM - PHA in Elizabeth, New Jersey. He was also a member of Golconda Temple #24 in Newark, New Jersey and the Phylaxis Society.

He joined Bethlehem Missionary Baptist Church in Roselle, New Jersey under the pastorate of Rev. Milton A. Byrd.

Willie Wiggins departed this life on Monday, January 14, 2013 at Robert Wood Johnson University Hospital at Rahway in Rahway, New Jersey at the age of 91. He was predeceased by his parents, Annie Bell and David Wiggins and 2 brothers, David Wiggins, Jr. and Joe Richard Wiggins.

He leaves to cherish fond memories, his beloved wife, Ida Batts Wiggins; a son, Henry Lawrence Young (Michelle) of Nashville, TN; a sister, Marion Rivers and brother, Alvin Wiggins both of the Bronx, New York; a devoted nephew, Camelious Batts of Roselle, NJ; 2 brothers-in-law, Paul Batts (Beulah) and James Lancaster both of Battle Boro, NC; a sister-in-law, Wilhemenia Batts Keeler; Past Grand Worthy Matron Rev.
