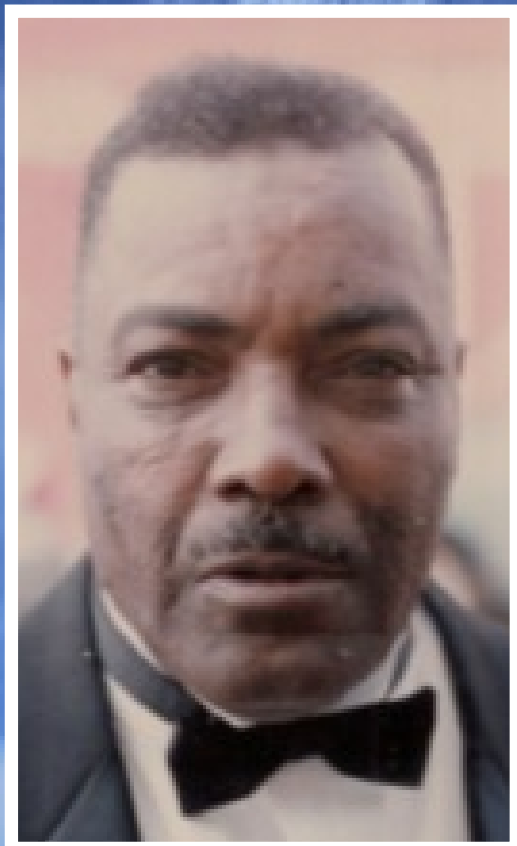

Reflections of Life

Lorenzo Wendell Moore was born on November 24, 1929 in Paterson, NJ. He was the youngest of five children born to the late Ethel Brown (Nee Clark) and Henry Moore.

Lorenzo attended Paterson Public Schools. He later joined the army in 1952, where he served in the Korean War. In 1958, he married, Louise Sermond and from this union five children were born. Lorenzo was employed by Continental Can and retired from the U.S. Postal Service after twenty-seven years. Upon retiring in 1992, Lorenzo and Louise relocated to Lake Wales, Florida where they lived for eighteen years. He and his bride returned to Paterson in 2009.

Lorenzo loved fishing, bowling and playing pool. He truly enjoyed life. He was a devoted husband to his wife for fifty-five years and was her primary caretaker for the last few years until his passing. He is preceded in death by one sister, Ruby Williams, one brother, Quentin Moore and two nephews.

Lorenzo was particularly fond of his oldest nephew, Dennis Witter (son of Aimee). The two shared a special bond throughout their lives. Dennis was extremely devoted to his uncle in health and in sickness.

He departed this life on Tuesday, January 15, 2013.
