## Obituary

On April 30, 1914, **Cora Lee Jackson** was born to James and Lula (Tyson) Jackson in Birmingham, Alabama. She returned to God's loving arms on Monday, January 28, 2013 at South Mountain Healthcare and Rehabilitation Center in Vauxhall, NJ. She was 98 years old at the time of her death. She was one of seven children: Ernest (Jimmy), George, Charlie, Annie Mae, Harvey, Rufus (Cout) and Johnnie Mae (Doll). Cora attended public schools until approximately the seventh grade. At some time in her youth, James moved the family to West Virginia after the death of Lula, his wife.

While in West Virginia, Cora met Silas Jones, Sr. On September 14, 1931, Silas and Cora were married. Out of the union, they had six children: Edith (Plunk), Silas, Jr. (Duke), Shirley (Jean), James, Charles and Darlyne (Renee'). All of the children were born in West Virginia except for Renee'. During that time, Silas worked in the coal mine and Cora was a housewife.

In 1952, the family moved to Newark, New Jersey. During this time, Cora was primarily a housewife but did work later in life at factories. In January 1975, Silas Sr. passed away and Cora remained a widow until the time of her death. Mrs. Jones spent most of her time interacting with her large family. She kept an extremely tidy home and was a great cook. She was extremely close to her sister, Doll. She always introduced herself as Mrs. Silas Jones and could tell a colorful story. She was a long time member of Queen of Angels Roman Catholic Church and sent her tithes in regularly even when she could no longer attend. She enjoyed playing the pick it. She was one of a kind and will be greatly missed.

In the 1997, Cora could no longer live by herself and went to live with her daughter, Renee' and granddaughter Tineshia. She remained there for almost two years until she then moved in with her daughter, Edith and her husband, Robert. During that time, Gwen White was her caretaker. Afterward, Cora required more care and was moved to Runnells Hospital in Berkley Heights, NJ. Just prior to her death, Cora was moved to South Mountain.

Mrs. Jones was preceded in death by her parents, all of her siblings, her husband, two sons: James and Charles Jones, and two grandchildren: Gary and Regina Williams. She leaves to mourn her death: her children Edith Williams (Robert) of Hillside, NJ; Silas Jones Jr. (Eva) of Newark, NJ; Shirley Caughman of Rahway, NJ and Darlyne Bobbitt of Newark, NJ. In addition, she leaves to mourn a sister-in-law, Katie Nell Howard of Madison Heights, Michigan; a daughter-in-law Deborah Jones; a special niece Gussie Mae Kelly; six grandsons: Samad Wadir, Rickey Jones, Marc Caughman, Sean Lawrence and Chris Jones; five granddaughters: Karima Abdul-Haqq, Lori Caughman, Deborah Jones, Regina Jones Booker and Tineshia Bobbitt; 16 great grand children, approximately 15 great- great grandchildren and a host of additional family members and friends.
