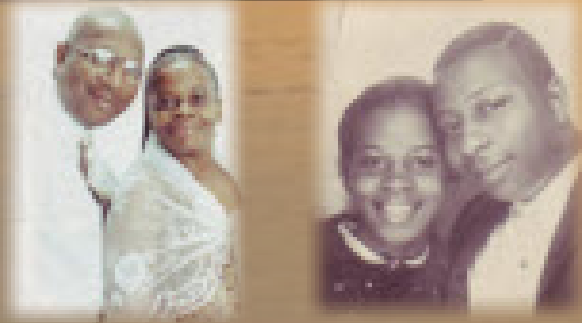


*A lover of God, a provider,
