# Life Reflections

Annabelle Johnson McIntyre was born to the late William and Anna Johnson on October 3, 1909 in the Prall Funeral Home in Roselle, New Jersey where her mother worked as a Housekeeper for Mr. Prall. She remained a resident of Roselle for 103 years. She graduated from Abraham Clark High School and Newark Normal School. She was employed as a Teacher in Maryland, and as a Supervisor and Federal Researcher for the Department of Defense in Springfield, New Jersey before retiring in 1972.

In 1890, Annabelle's father, William was one of the founding members of Second Baptist Church in Roselle, New Jersey. She was baptized in the church by the late Rev. W. Scott on Easter Sunday in 1921. Annabelle was very active in the church and held positions in the auxiliaries and organizations. However, her first love was Sunday school. She became a Sunday School Teacher while in High School and held that position until she felt it was time to step aside because of her age. She continued to attend the Adult Class because she felt one could always learn more about the Bible. Her strong faith and belief in God kept her through many of life's trials and tribulations.

Annabelle loved to travel. She toured Egypt, Israel, Hawaii and Alaska and cruised the Caribbean many times extensively throughout the United States often with her lifelong friend, the late Ethel Pulley.

Her hobbies included sewing, knitting and crocheting. She was an excellent cook and baker; her family especially enjoyed her "famous" yeast rolls and pies.

Annabelle was predeceased by her husband George H. McIntyre on August 8, 1972, daughter, Arnetta McIntyre and in previous years by her five brothers.

On Friday, March 29, 2013, at the tender age 103 Mrs. Annabelle Johnson McIntyre was called from this earthy home to that glorious heavenly home.

Annabelle Johnson McIntyre leaves to cherish her precious memories her children, George McIntyre of High Point, North Carolina; Samuel McIntyre, Mae McIntyre and Marian Cole of Roselle, New Jersey; ten grandchildren, four great-grandchildren and one great-granddaughter, and a host of nieces, nephews, other relatives and friends.
