Reflections of Life

Rev. Odessa Vera (Johnson) Robinson was born in Bat Cave, North Carolina on May 27, 1925. Her family later relocated to Conway, South Carolina. She was the third of six children, three daughters and two sons born to the late Jimmie and Roberta (Luke) Johnson.

She was educated in the Conway School system graduating from Whittemore High School, Conway, SC.

She attended the Mason Temple Church of God in Christ Conway, South Carolina, where she accepted the Lord Jesus Christ as her personal Savior at the age of seventeen, where her parents were co-founders and the late Bishop J.W. Wilson, Pastor.

Rev. Robinson was united in Holy Matrimony to the late Deacon Edward J. Robinson in June of 1952. They were happily married for over thirty-four years. To this union five children were born, Rebecca, Vera, Henry, Edith and Samuel. They relocated to Paterson, New Jersey along with their first born daughter, Rebecca in October of 1955. Once in Paterson, Rev. Robinson began looking for a church home. A family friend, Matthew Rhue told her about Jackson Temple Church of God in Christ located in Hackensack, New Jersey. She became a member of The Jackson Temple Church. Living in Paterson, she desired a church home closer. In April of 1956, her nephew, Selton Scott told her of a church around the corner from her house. The church was the former Faith Tabernacle Church of God in Christ, where the late Elder Clarence Gilmore was the pastor. She went that night and felt the presence of the Lord there and joined that very night.

Rev. Robinson was employed by the North Jersey Training School in Totowa, New Jersey as a Supervisor for twenty-two years before retiring in 1987. Because of her passion for the love of children, she later returned to school to receive her Child Care Certificate from Passaic County Community College in Paterson.

Rev. Robinson was a member of Gilmore Memorial Tabernacle Look and Live Ministry in Paterson, New Jersey for over fifty-five years. During her years of service she served as the President of the Floral Club, a Group Leader, she was a Deaconess, member of the Nurse's Unit, Helping Hand, Pastor's Aide, Interdenominational Women's Conference, Golden Age, Women's Council and Sunday School. She was ordained an Elder in 1995.

Rev. Odessa Robinson was greatly inspired through the word and teachings of God, by her late pastors Elder Clarence Gilmore who would later become Bishop Clarence Gilmore and after his death by his beloved wife her friend, Rev. Dr. Allene Gilmore. One of her favorite scripture was Isaiah 55:5.

In her community she was a member of the Silver Light Ladies Club. Rev. Robinson was greatly loved by those in her community. People would often come to her for Godly Advice and words of encouragement. She is affectionately known as Mom, Grandma, Granny and Queen Mother.

She was predeceased by her husband, Deacon Edward Robinson, daughters, Edith Nadine and Vera Theresa Robinson-Crockett, granddaughter, Viola Robinson and brother, Jewel Johnson.
