Elder John E. Schenk, 91, departed this life on May 13, 2013 at JFK Medical Center in Edison, NJ. Born in Sommerville, NJ, he resided in Plainfield, NJ for several years. After returning from the U.S. Navy he moved his family to South Plainfield and resided there for over sixty-one years.

As a young man he started working at Kings Supermarket and proceeded to move up the ranks to Assistant Store Manager.
