

### **Obituary**

**William "Pop" Anderson** was born on December 25, 1918 in Amelia County (Mattox), Virginia. He was born to the late Betty Jeter and William Anderson. On Sunday morning, May 26, 2013, he was summoned by the voice of Jesus, from his labor to reward.

In 1940, he was united in Holy Matrimony to Betty Cornelia Branch. After establishing their home, they became the parents of nine children, four alive.

He worked for many years for the sanitation department for the City of Newark before retiring in the early 1980's. He also worked part time at Two Guys in Union, NJ.

Spain. Later he along with his wife became members of the Macedonia Baptist Church where he served as an usher under the late Dr. J. Calhoun and Rev. James A. Tyson before leaving to work with his son, Pastor Eddie Douglas Anderson and The Tabernacle of Jesus, Family Church, also serving as an usher. He loved the leaders and especially the young people, the Lord was adding to His kingdom. When you asked Pop what was his testimony, his response with a smile was, "more love".

Pop and Betty were married for 62 years before she passed away on January 29, 2003.

William, or more affectionately known as Mr. Shorty, was a car mechanic for the neighborhood families, in his spare time. He was a die-hard fan of the New York Mets and loved watching the Wheel of fortune.
