

Reflections of Life

Willie Smith was born to the late Walter Henry and Cora Lee Smith on February 12, 1928 in Rowland, NC. He was educated in the Robeson County school system. At an early age, he accepted Christ as his personal savior.

In 1951, he relocated to Newark NJ to seek a better opportunity for him and his two children. He started his career in the wire industry at Hatfield Wire & Cable and was employed there for seventeen years. In 1968, he joined Brazill Bros & Assoc. He remained at Brazill Bros for twenty-five years and retired as the warehouse manager in 1993.

In 1972, he married the love of his life Lula M. Singer. Willie and Lula relocated to Metuchen, NJ in 1972 and later to Piscataway in 1978. To this union, one daughter was born. Together, the family joined North Stelton A.M.E. Church in Piscataway, NJ in May 1978. At North Stelton, Willie was instrumental with assisting with the original building construction. He was also the 2nd Steward appointed to the church where he served faithfully as treasurer for several years. He was an original member of the Inspirational Male Choir, member of the Finance Committee, and a member of the former NSAME bowling league. He remained a loyal member of North Stelton until his health failed.

After his official retirement, Willie decided to return to the workforce by working part time as a school bus aide for Ryder Transportation. He enjoyed sharing his wisdom with the kids and often had a joke to share. Willie was also active in the Piscataway community and served as an election poll worker for over fifteen years. In 2012, Willie joined the COPSA Day Program in Piscataway. He enjoyed the fellowship with the other participants and kept the group entertained with stories from his younger years.

Willie, affectionately known as "Bud" to his family and "Smitty" to his friends enjoyed his life to the fullest. He will always be remembered for being "a consummate gentleman". He enjoyed time shared with family and friends. His favorite past times were traveling, bowling, watching sports (especially the L.A. Dodgers), and tending to his lawn and garden. He also enjoyed shopping as demonstrated in the pride he took in looking his best.

Willie was called home to be with the Lord on June 20, 2013 at Robert Wood Johnson University Hospital in New Brunswick, NJ. He assured his family before his passing that he lived a happy and blessed life and was ready when the Lord returned for him.

Willie was a dedicated family man and leaves to cherish his memory: wife of forty-one years, Lula M. Smith; one son, Willie Charles Smith (Hattie) of Rowland, NC; two daughters, Ruby Parker (Ron) of Newark, NJ and Stephanie Evans (Greg) of Somerset, NJ; two grand-daughters, Lander McClure (Tony) of Silver Springs, MD and Lakeisha Parker of Newark, NJ; two great granddaughters, Jade Reyna of Silver Springs, MD and Ajayla Parker of Newark, NJ; One brother Evans Smith (Inez) of Newark, NJ; one brother-in law, Millard Redding (Diane) of Hillside, NJ; one sister-in-law, Ruth Redding, of Newark, NJ; and a host of nieces, nephews, cousins, and friends.
