Remembering Eugene

Eugene “Pop” Hardrick was born April 1, 1935 in Lumpkin, Georgia, son of the late Choice and Rosie Miller Hardrick. He attended the Stewart County Public Schools and was a member of Philadelphia Baptist Church in Lumpkin, Georgia. He lived in Newark, New Jersey before moving to Roselle 45 years ago.

Eugene met and married Ruby Lee Scott in 1958.

He was a Textile Knitter for Fablok Mills in Murray Hill, New Jersey for over 20 years.

Eugene attended and successfully completed his Auto Mechanic Certification at Lincoln Technical Institute in Union. He worked for Shell Gas and purchased a Shell Gas station in Hillside.
