

<u>Obituary</u>

Rev. Dr. Thaddeus Thomas Gooden, Jr. was born on April 19, 1925, in Elloree, South Carolina. Dr. Gooden was born to the late Rev. T. T. Gooden, Sr. and Prentice Grant Gooden. Dr. Gooden relocated with his family to Harlem, New York, where he completed his formative studies at Benjamin Franklin High School in 1943.

As a young man "T.T. Gooden" was enlisted in the United States Army from 1943 through 1945. He was honorably discharged from the Army and awarded three Bronze Star Medals. He continued his military career in the United States Air Force Reserves, where he dutifully served from 1956 until he was honorably discharged in 1967. As a respected Veteran, T.T. Gooden was asked to accompany officers as they notified families of the naval incident which left his son, Shawn and shipmates lost at sea. His sense of integrity, loyalty, discipline and order were shaped by these military experiences, together with his profound upbringing in the Church - these core values were steadfast, throughout Dr. Gooden's life.

Dr. Gooden began his life in service to God, as an ordained Deacon at the Shiloh Baptist Church, under the leadership of Rev. Morgan C. Days, in Rockville Centre, New York. Later, he answered his call to the gospel ministry. His ministerial training was received from the National Theological Seminary and College, located in Baltimore, Maryland. Dr. Gooden maintained a strict study regimen. He excelled in the areas of theology, history and philosophy, and earned his Bachelor's and Master's Degree in Divinity. He was also awarded an Honorary Doctorate Degree in recognition of his outstanding work as a Philanthropist and his contributions to Theological Studies in 1982. He was a great supporter of Shaw University Divinity School, in Raleigh, North Carolina.

Dr. Gooden affectionately joined and worshiped with his father, Rev. T. T. Gooden, Sr. at Greater Emmanuel Baptist Church (formerly known as Emmanuel Baptist Church). After a period of training and study, he became Co-Pastor. He was later installed as Pastor of the Greater Emmanuel Baptist Church in 1978. In 1984, tragedy struck the Church. Archives of the New York Daily Newspaper, Jet Magazine and other national news outlets reflect the shell of the Church - still smoking – as a result of a multiple alarm fire. The congregation was devastated. Dr. Gooden did not miss a beat in fundraising and obtaining financing to restore the congregation's edifice. By the grace of God, Emmanuel was rebuilt in 1988. Mayor Koch attended the groundbreaking ceremony. The edifice continues to stand today, and consists of a sanctuary (with balcony), a full-service dining hall, archival room, nurses' room, choir room, and educational facilities. Dr. Gooden's tribute room was dedicated in 1995.

Professionally, T.T. Gooden worked with several New York City municipal agencies, including the Department of Sanitation and the Department of Environmental Protection, where he worked from 1951 until he retired in 1971. T.T. Gooden was known throughout his life as jovial in regards to his social dealings, yet admired for his stern approach in his professional tasks. As a conscientious worker, T.T. Gooden received numerous commendations and recognitions for meritorious service.

In addition, T.T. Gooden developed a great acumen for the real estate business. Having owned, developed, and/or managed numerous homes and rental properties; he shared his skills and assisted many in establishing their lives, buying homes, and rearing their own families.

His sense of stewardship was even more awe-inspiring. By God's gift alone, Dr. Gooden was an expert at financial management, budgeting and fiscal propriety. His religious and political affiliations, together with these skills, were invaluable in the development of community projects which spanned over several communities and generations.

His community affiliations included serving as Chairman of the Hempstead Citizens Advisory Committee and Founder and President of the Lakeview Garden Block Association. His financial acumen led him to join in the founding of the Vanguard National Bank of Hempstead (which later became Guardian National Bank) and Board Member of the ADD/ADHD Housing Group, Inc., which provides emergency services for troubled and homeless mothers and children.

T.T. Gooden was widely known and served in various capacities in New York City based organizations. He rendered his professional expertise as an Advisor to the developer, Harlem United in building the multi-unit senior housing development, which sits adjacent to the Greater Emmanuel Baptist Church.

During his ministry, he also became actively affiliated with numerous denominational and clergy fellowships, including, the United Missionary Baptist Association, the National Baptist Convention USA, Inc., the NAACP and his beloved Baptist Ministers' Conference of Greater New York & Vicinity.

Dr. Gooden built a beloved community among his colleagues in the ministry. He hosted an annual Fourth of July Poolside BBQ and Fellowship at his home in Long Island, New York, which was highly coveted among members of the conference. This fellowship was a welcomed moment in the midst of hectic and harried lives of Pastors (and their families) from the New York City vicinity. He also extended such invitations to his Church family, Emmanuel. The Church enjoyed these annual visits to Dr. Gooden's home - which continue to this day. The atmosphere was one of pure delight and fun.

In addition to his hospitality, Dr. Gooden embraced the task of visiting sick colleagues and their families, and developed the Visitation and Sick Committee of the Baptist Ministers' Conference of Greater New York & Vicinity. During his tenure as Chairman, he raised money to provide gifts to the sick. He tirelessly visited his hospitalized, homebound or otherwise indisposed colleagues. His faithful visits helped to ensure that these ill Pastors and/or Ministers were not forgotten.

As a family man, Rev. Dr. Thaddeus Thomas Gooden, Jr. was simply extraordinary. Dr. Gooden will be eternally loved by those whose lives he created and each life that he touched. Dr. Gooden's sons, Erick and Shawn, and his sister, Gladyus, precede him in death. Dr. Gooden is survived by his beloved wife of twenty-one years and partner in Pastoral Ministry, Rev. Marjorie Jean Taylor Gooden; daughter, Nicole Renee, an Attorney in Albany, New York, in whom Dr. Gooden delighted. Dr. Gooden is also survived by his eldest daughter, Kathleen of Eastover, South Carolina; Michelle of Berryville, Virginia; Winifred of Long Island, New York; and son, Brian of the Bronx, New York. Also surviving Dr. Gooden, are his daughters, Sophia and Sandy and his son, Anthony. There is one surviving nephew, Julian, twenty-two grandchildren, twenty-seven great grandchildren, numerous great nieces, nephews, cousins, extended family, beloved friends, colleagues in the gospel ministry, and the ever beloved Greater Emmanuel Baptist Church Family.
