**Adam Napoleon Solomon** was born on February 12,1922 in Cochran, GA to Will and Queenie (Thomas) Solomon.

He was a survivor of the Port Chicago, California submarine explosion of 1945. He received an honorably discharge. He worked at Laurel Rubber Company in Garfield for seventeen years. He later became a maintenance mechanic with NJ Transit for twenty years before retiring. After his retirement he worked at the Laundry Basket in Paterson for ten years before becoming a school crossing guard for the City of Paterson until 2009.
