<u>Obituary</u>

**Presiding Elder Richard T. Druid** was reared in Atlantic City, New Jersey, where he attended the public schools and graduated from the Atlantic City High School. He was a resident of Edison for the past twenty-five years and formerly of Clark, NJ. He was raised in Second Baptist Church, Atlantic City under the care of his loving parents, who were devout members. Richard was known for his athletic prowess, his engaging smile, pleasant personality, was very popular among his peers, and was a lover of sports, notably basketball.

He left Atlantic City as a young man and was eventually called into God's service. Although he was reared and nurtured at Second Baptist Church in Newark, God had great things for him to do in the African Methodist Episcopal Church. Rev. Druid joined the pulpit staff at St. Luke A.M.E. Church in Newark, where he became a protégé of Rev. John G. Ragin. He pastored at the Mt. Zion A.M.E. Church in Princeton; Allen A.M.E. Church in Newark and Mt. Zion A.M.E. Church in Plainfield where he rendered outstanding service.

Eighteen years ago, the Right Rev. Philip R. Cousin, then Bishop of the First Episcopal District, selected him to become one of the presiding elders in his cabinet. Since that time, he has led the rising Atlantic City District into a position of prominence within the African Methodist Episcopal Church. Presiding Elder Druid was known as Dean of the New Jersey Conference Presiding Elders, he was the second most Senior Presiding Elder of the 1st Episcopal District and Vice President of the Presiding Elders Council, he was well known as a dynamic preacher, organizer, fundraiser and dedicated servant of God. He became one of the outstanding leaders not only in the Atlantic City District but throughout the entire connection. He retired June 2013.

Presiding Elder Druid was a "People Person". He treated each of his pastors and every member of the Atlantic City District with dignity and respect. He always encouraged everyone to do their best. Bold and intrepid, he was the first Presiding Elder, along with his district, to host the New Jersey Annual Conference at a hotel. In the year 2000, the seat of the New Jersey Conference was held at the Sheraton Hotel in Atlantic City.

He was an amiable man with an infectious sense of humor and a big heart. "Richie" was also a compassionate person, who during her extended illness diligently ministered to the needs of his late wife, Ernestine, the beloved First Lady of the Atlantic City District.

Among his notable characteristics, these are two that stand out; he was a man of his word and if he was your friend, he would be your friend through thick and thin. The A.M.E. Church, New Jersey Conference and especially the Atlantic City District were blessed to have this giant of a man to walk among them.

He was Owner operator of RTD Management Corp. Elder Druid was a veteran of the U.S. Air-force.

He was predeceased by his loving wife, Ernestine, parents, John and Marion and three brothers, Donald, John & Webster. He leaves to cherish his memory: his daughter, Porshca Glisson; sisters-in-law, Edna McLaughlin, Willean Anderson and Rodean Druid; devoted caregiver, La-Tanja Edwards; godson, Kenneth L. Saunders; and a host of devoted family and friends.
