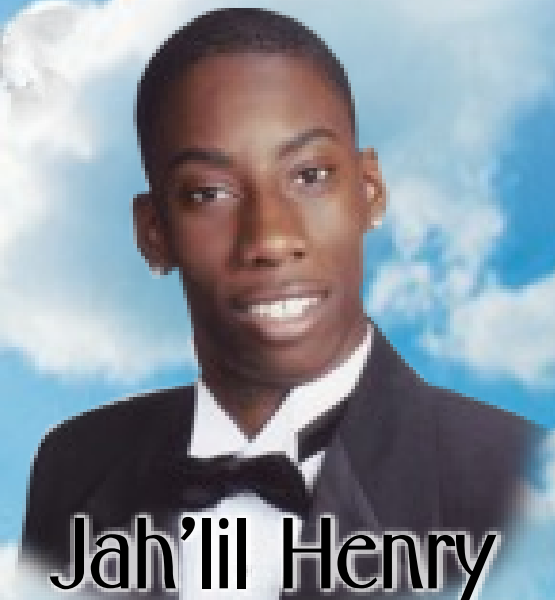

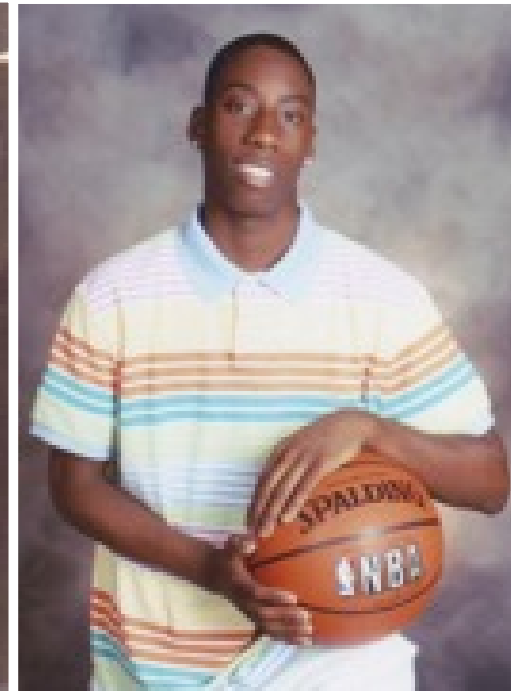

Fuquan A. Davis passed away on August 30, 2013.

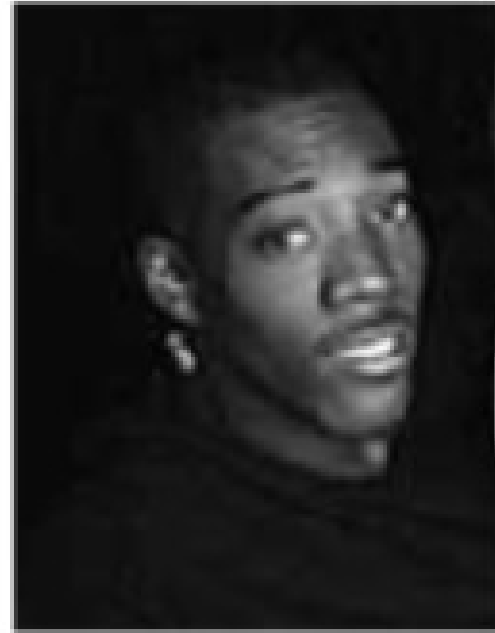
Fuquan Andre Davis was born June 2, 1988 in Newark, NJ to Ellis Roberts and Rondell Yvette Davis.
